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## 1 Problem 1

### 1.1 Problem statement

Write a function which finds a maximum out of two user supplied numbers.

### 1.2 Solution

First we need to compare two numbers which leads to the straightforward if-else construct which selects the proper answer. However there is one special case when both inputs are the same. The comparison should have $\geq$ comparison operator to include this case into decision tree. See the resulting function find_max in the listing 1.

### 1.3 Test cases

To check the validity of the code I tried 3 possible combination of the input parameters. When first argument is smaller then second, when first argument is lager then second, and finally when they are both the same. The results of the tests are as expected (see listing 2.
